The Gettysburg Soup Kitchen has been a cornerstone for those in need of a nutritious meal for over 25 Years. The kitchen is open seven days a week for a midday meal regardless of bad weather or observance of holidays. Guests are welcome with no questions asked. Anyone who comes in is welcome to sit down and share the meal. The soup kitchen serves an average of 45 guests each day; including both adults and children. With its roots in the church community, the soup kitchen family of meal sponsors and volunteers has grown to include many businesses, organizations, civic groups and social clubs. Members of our community have served with pride for more than 25 years. We appreciate all of these individuals and groups who play a significant role in our continued success and we are blessed to be the beneficiary of their gifts.

Services Daily Meal Program

Doors at the Peace House dining room open at 11:15 AM with service beginning between 11:20 AM and 11:30 AM and ending at 12:30 PM. An average of 45-60 guests are served each day and guests are able to receive a first and second serving. Our meal is important to our guests not only for its nutritional value, but also as a means to establish social connections in a warm and welcoming environment. Since 1991, our total meals served exceeds 300,000 with 14,253 in 2019.

Voucher Program

This program helps those who regularly join us for meals and who need additional help when their food is running low. Guests who dine with us 8 times a month or more receive a \$15.00 grocery store gift voucher once a month. The voucher entitles each guest a credit towards meat, fish and dairy products at Kennie's Food Market.

New House Groceries Program

This program is designed to benefit guests who have recently received new permanent housing. GCSK provides a kit with a basic set of items to welcome them to their new home. The kit includes essential food staples, basic cookware, and fundamental cleaning supplies. This program facilitates the recipient's independence in multiple ways.

Additional renovations are in the works for the coming year. We look forward to the completion of the kitchen upgrades and storage area projects as well as new flooring throughout the building. In the past year multiple groups and individuals such as Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts have taken an interest in the soup kitchen and have been donating time and materials to clean, paint, make curtains and raise funds for other projects and renovations. Many are working on special badges making these partnerships a win-win result for all of us.

If you have never been to the soup kitchen, we encourage you to stop by to see how things work and what a great service we provide to the community. We are proud of what we continue to accomplish each day.

Finance Committee Report

In 2019, the Soup Kitchen benefited from donations and contributions from the local community, from businesses, individuals, churches, foundations, grants, and memorials. In-kind donations also made it possible for the Soup Kitchen to provide nutritional meals for our guests. Cash contributions helped with our other major expenses, which included maintenance, improvements, grocery purchases, voucher-program, payroll for our employees, and the cost of daily operations for the kitchen itself.

Our 2019 total income surpassed that of the previous year. The funds we received from the Adams County Giving Spree was substantially higher than 2018. We assume this may be due to a healthy economy, but we are very cautious to keep costs as low as possible, so we are prepared for any future economic corrections. Our largest increase in cost last year was primarily due to increased wages. Moving our payroll to an outside firm increased costs slightly, but provided consistent, reliable payroll support. The Kitchen staff was reduced due to employees choosing to leave, however other employees were able to pick up the additional workload so there were no new employees added to our payroll in 2019.

The faithful work of our great volunteers makes the Soup Kitchen's presence in the Gettysburg area possible. The value of that work is beyond measure.

The Board has a few projects planned for 2020. Replacing the worn flooring, replacing some cabinets in our storage area, and replacing cabinets in the main kitchen area are our primary projects.

Our Board members are committed to making the operation of this great community service as efficient as possible.
